

## JOINT CONTROL TEAMS FOR HEAVY VEHICLES

Roadside checks are carried out by Joint Control Teams consisting of 2 representatives of the local Transport and Communications Service and 1 official of the Traffic Department.

## The checks conducted include:

- •Identification check (Chassis and engine number, license plates)
- •Circulation-legality check (Licences, dimensions, load weights, vehicle marking)
- •**Vehicle-status check** (Windscreen, glass panels, bodywork, doors, bumpers, colouring, hitch, spoiler, lights, mirrors, wheels, tyres, axles, suspension)
- •Engine check (Leaks, electrical system, battery)
- •Steering check (Pump, hoses)
- ·Cabin check

(Steering wheel, speedometer, seat belts, seats, horn)

- •Safety-equipment check (Fire extinguisher, warning triangle, first aid kit)
- Exhaust-emissions check
- Brake check
- Lighting check
- Tyre check
- Driving-speed check (Tachograph)
- Load check (Secure loading)

## **IN SUMMARY**

The Joint Team checks the vehicle's safety and suitability for road traffic, as well as its compliance with emissions regulations. In cases where the imposition of a fine (or fines) is provided, the control authorities remove the vehicle's registration particulars. The fine imposition notice serves in place of the vehicle's registration particulars for a period of seven (7) days. Vehicles from which the registration particulars have been removed are not allowed to leave the country.

## REQUIRED DOCUMENTS TO BE PRESENTED TO THE JOINT CONTROL TEAM:

- Driver's ID or passport
- Driver's licence
- Digital tachograph card
- Vehicle registration document
- Vehicle Roadworthiness Certificate
- Vehicle insurance
- International consignment note (CMR)
- ADR certificate (for dangerous goods)
- ATP certificate (for perishable foods)
- •Transit permits (multilateral, bilateral, transit)
- •Community licence for the international carriage of goods or passengers by road for hire or reward
